Many licensed veterinarians provide equine dental care. If a person is not an Arizona licensed veterinarian, he/she may register with the Arizona Veterinary Medical Examining Board as an Equine Dental Practitioner. That person must be certified by the International Association of Equine Dentistry or the Academy of Equine Dentistry and be under the general or direct supervision of an Arizona licensed veterinarian.\*

The equine practitioner must provide to the Board, proof of certification and a written statement signed by the supervising Arizona licensed veterinarian. Both the supervising veterinarian and the certified equine dental practitioner must maintain dental charts for procedures performed. An equine dental practitioner may not prescribe or administer any drug or medicine, which includes types of anesthesia. The registered equine dental practitioner may not perform extractions unless a licensed veterinarian is physically present for the procedure.
