INSTRUCTIONS FOR CERTIFIED VETERINARY TECHNICIANS

Please read all the enclosed information and instructions carefully before submitting your application. Your application must be complete prior to the deadline of the State exam you wish to take; you will be notified if your application is incomplete. There are no refunds for applications. If you fail the State exam, you will need to reapply!

The universal recognition policy allows Arizona residents to use an out-of-state professional or occupational license to qualify for an Arizona license to work. To qualify, an applicant must:

- 1. Prove residency in Arizona
- 2. Be currently licensed or certified for at least ONE YEAR in another U.S. state in the discipline applied for and at the same level of practice as recognized in Arizona.
- 3. Be in good standing in all states where currently or previously licensed or certified.
- 4. Must not have had a certificate/license revoked or have voluntarily surrendered a certificate/license in any other state or country while under investigation for unprofessional conduct.
- 5. Must not have a complaint, allegation, or investigation pending before another regulating entity in another state or country that relates to unprofessional conduct.
- 6. Must have met all applicable education, work, exam, and/or clinical supervision requirements in the other state where originally licensed or certified.
- 7. TAKE AND PASS THE ARIZONA STATE CVT EXAM (70% score minimum)
- 8. Pay all applicable fees to the Arizona State Veterinary Medical Examining Board

Application requirements:

- 1. Notarized Application Form (Date of applicant's signature and notarization date must match.)
- A non-refundable fee of \$150. This fee must be paid by cashier's check or money order made payable to Arizona State Veterinary Medical Examining Board (AZVMEB).
 WE DO NOT ACCEPT PERSONAL CHECKS, BUSINESS CHECKS, CREDIT CARDS OR CASH.
- 3. A photograph taken within the last six months, preferably passport size. THIS IS A SEPARATE REQUIREMENT FROM #6
- 4. **Proof of current Arizona residency** (Documents accepted (one must be submitted: Valid Arizona Drivers License, a current Arizona motor vehicle registration, current Arizona voter registration, Military Form 2058, or proof of filing Arizona income taxes in the most recent tax year.)
- 5. Documentation proving legal presence in the U.S. The name on the documentation must match the name of the applicant. If different, please submit supporting documentation, such as a marriage certificate, divorce decree, etc. Refer to the "Evidence of U.S. Citizenship, U.S. National Status, or Alien Status" list in this packet. DO NOT SUBMIT ORIGINAL DOCS--SEND COPIES!
- 6. Submit a copy of a government-issued photo identification. Examples: driver's license, U.S. passport, U.S. military I.D.
- 7. Provide certificate/license verifications sent directly to the Board from the state(s) you are/have ever been certified/licensed in that indicate your status and any disciplinary actions. (Depending on the state, it can take several weeks for this to occur!)
- 8. Provide court records/documents and applicant's narrative regarding reportable charges (if applicable)

OPTIONAL FEE WAIVER FOR LOW INCOME APPLICANTS: Per A.R.S. 41-1080.01, an applicant applying for an initial license whose family income does not exceed two hundred percent of the federal poverty guidelines may be eligible for a fee waiver. If you believe that you may qualify, please contact Board staff at 602-542-8166 to request the Application of Waiver of Initial Licensing Fees.

CERTIFIED VETERINARIAN TECHNICIAN STATE EXAM DATES & DEADLINES

Due to COVID-19 related procedures, the State CVT exam is an "open book" exam which will be EMAILED to you on the release date noted below. Applicants will have 2 weeks to complete the exam and return it to the Board office. Please note this process is tied to an Executive Order related to COVID and thus, may end at any point.

The exam is 50 T/F questions covering the Arizona Revised Statutes (i.e., the AZ Veterinary Practice Act) and the Administrative Rules. Note: If you fail the exam, you must re-apply!

<u>State Exam Application Deadline</u> <u>State Exam Release Date (Emailed)</u>

July 27, 2021 for August 27, 2021

NOTE! Once the State exam is passed, an issuance fee of \$50 in an odd-numbered year or \$25 in an even-numbered year is required prior to issuance of the certificate.


All certificates expire 12/31 of every even-numbered year, regardless of when it was issued.

What happens after you submit your application?

- 1. By law, the Board has 30 days to review your application to determine if it is complete. However, usually, that process is much faster. You will be notified of any items or corrections that are needed to complete your application. If you are trying to take the exam in a certain month, or ASAP, you should submit your application at least 2 weeks prior to a deadline so that you will have time to deal with gathering any missing documents.
- Once your application is complete, we will notify you and schedule you for the next exam date that
 you qualified for based on your completion date and exam deadline date. Exam study materials will
 be mailed to you; however, you can also view/download the documents at vetboard.az.gov/
 statutes-and-rules.
- 3. Exams are expected to be emailed on the release date noted above. You will have 2 weeks to take the exam and email, fax, or mail it back to us. It is an "open book" test.
- 4. Exams will be graded in 1-2 weeks. If you have passed, we will notify you about your exam score and next steps. If you have failed, the Board will deny your certificate and you must re-apply (including paying the application fee again.)
- 5. You will need to submit the certificate issuance fee (\$25 even-numbered years/\$50 odd-numbered years) prior to the issuance of the certificate. (Fee may be paid by personal, business, cashier's/certified check, or money order.)

A.R.S. §41-1030(B): An agency shall not base a licensing decision in whole or in part on a licensing requirement or condition that is not specifically authorized by statute, rule or state tribal gaming compact. A.R.S. §41-1030(D): This section may be enforced in private civil action and relief may be awarded against the state. The court may award reasonable attorney fees, damages and all fees associated with the license application to a party that prevails in an action against the state for a violation of this section.

A.R.S. §41-1030(E): A state employee may not intentionally or knowingly violate this section. A violation of this section is cause for disciplinary action or dismissal pursuant to the agency's adopted personnel policy.

A.R.S. §41-1030(F): This section does not abrogate the immunity provided by section 12-820.01 or 12-820.02.

Professional License and Commercial License Arizona State Veterinary Medical Examining Board

- 2. A driver license issued by a state that verifies lawful presence in the United States.
- 3. A birth certificate or delayed birth certificate showing birth in one of the 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico (on or after January 13, 1941), Guam, the U.S. Virgin Islands (on or after January 17, 1917), American Samoa, or the Northern Mariana Islands (on or after November 4, 1986, Northern Mariana Islands localtime)
- 4. A United States certificate of birth abroad.
- A United States passport. ***Passport must besigned***
- 6. A foreign passport with a United Statesvisa.
- 7. An I-94 form with a photograph.
- 8. A United States citizenship and immigration services employment authorization document or refugee travel document.
- 9. A United States certificate of naturalization.
- 10. A United States certificate of citizenship.
- 11. A tribal certificate of Indianblood.
- 12. A tribal or bureau of Indian affairs affidavit ofbirth.
- 13. Any other license that is issued by the federal government, any other state government, an agency of this state or a political subdivision of this state that requires proof of citizenship or lawful alien status before issuing the license.
