Practice Act is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.

The Arizona State Veterinary Medical Examining Board ("Board") has probable cause to believe that you are impersonating a doctor of veterinary medicine in Arizona. Specifically, in your efforts to obtain employment to provide veterinary services in Arizona, you made several false statements regarding your licensure status and professional experience. Doing so constitutes a violation of A.R.S. § 32-2212 (E), which states in part, no person shall... use the word doctor, veterinary, veterinarian... or any combination thereof of similar import in connection with such person's name...unless such person is licensed to practice veterinary medicine under this chapter; and A.R.S. § 32-2238, which states that a person who practices veterinary medicine or surgery, as defined in A.R.S. §32-2231, without a license and registration, who unlawfully assumes or advertises a veterinary title conveying the impression that the person is a lawful practitioner of veterinary medicine, or who violates any provision of the Veterinary

By authority under A.R.S. § 32-2237(E), if the Board has probable cause to believe that an unlicensed person is performing acts requiring licensure or violating the Veterinary Practice Act, it may do any or more of the following:

- 1. Issue a cease and desist order.
- 2. Request the county attorney or attorney general to file criminal charges against the person.
- 3. File an action in superior court to enjoin the person from engaging in the unlicensed practice of veterinary medicine.
- 4. After notice and an opportunity for a hearing, impose a civil penalty of not more than one thousand dollars for each violation.

THE BOARD ISSUES THIS CEASE AND DESIST ORDER. Kara Keller shall cease from engaging in the impersonation of a veterinarian as defined in A.R.S. § 32-2231 or in any other manner violating the Arizona Veterinary Practice Act. WARNING: Should you fail to comply with this Cease and Desist Order at any time, the Board reserves the right to take any of the further legal actions authorized under A.R.S. § 32-2237(E).

NOTICE: Pursuant to section 41-1093.01, Arizona Revised Statutes, an agency shall limit all occupational regulations to regulations that are demonstrated to be necessary to specifically fulfill a public health, safety or welfare concern. Pursuant to sections 41-1093.02 and 41-1093.03, Arizona Revised Statutes, you have the right to petition this agency to repeal or modify the occupational regulation or bring an action in a court of general jurisdiction to challenge the occupational regulation and to ensure compliance with section 41-1093.01, Arizona Revised Statutes.
