Dear Applicant:

Thank you for your request for an application and information regarding Arizona's veterinarian licensing and examination procedures. Licensure is available to graduates from a college of veterinary medicine accredited by the American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA) and to applicants who hold an Educational Commission for Foreign Veterinary Graduates (ECFVG) certificate issued by the AVMA or a Program for the Assessment of Veterinary Education Equivalence (PAVE) certificate issued by the American Association of Veterinary State Boards (AAVSB).

The most common pathways to licensure are via *Regular*, *Endorsement*, *Universal Recognition*, or *Specialty License*. For your convenience, the requirements for each category are listed separately in this packet. A brief explanation follows:

- **Regular License:** The applicant is a graduate from a college of veterinary medicine accredited by the AVMA, or holds a certificate of completion issued by the ECFVG or PAVE. The applicant must have passed the North American Veterinary Licensing Examination (NAVLE) examination with a score of at least 425 (75%) within 5 years of application for state examination and licensure. For further requirements and instructions, please see the page titled, "*Instructions for Completing the Application Process: Application for Regular License.*"
- **Endorsement License:** The applicant is a graduate from a college of veterinary medicine accredited by the AVMA, or holds a certificate of completion issued by ECFVG or PAVE and has not taken the NAVLE within the past 5 years. The applicant is currently licensed as a practicing veterinarian in another state or Canada and has been working as a veterinarian in the U.S. or Canada for several years*. *For list of complete requirements and instructions, please see the page titled, "*Instructions for Completing the Application Process: Application for Licensure by Endorsement.*"
- **Universal Recognition pathway:** The applicant is an Arizona resident who is licensed in at least one other state and has held the license for at least one year at the same level of practice as recognized in Arizona. Must not have a complaint/investigation pending in any other state or country. Must not have had a license revoked or voluntarily surrendered a license in any other state or country while under investigation for unprofessional conduct.
- **Specialty License:** The applicant is a graduate from a college of veterinary medicine accredited by the AVMA, or holds a certificate of completion issued by ECFVG or PAVE and holds a current certification as a diplomate of a national specialty board or college recognized by the AVMA. Passing the NAVLE prior to or after application is not required for this type of license. NOTE: The applicant's practice will be limited to the scope of the applicant's board certification. For further requirements and instructions, please see the page titled, "*Instructions for Completing the Application Process: Application for Licensure as Specialty.*"

An applicant who holds a veterinary license in another state in good standing who needs to practice veterinary medicine while awaiting completion of the licensing process may apply for a 30-day Temporary License. Please call the Licensing staff at 602-542-8166 for information about the Temporary License.

NAVLE ONLY: An applicant who is a current student in the last year of a college of veterinary medicine accredited by the AVMA or a graduate of a college of veterinary medicine accredited by the AVMA or who is enrolled in the ECFVG or PAVE program may apply to take the NAVLE examination. To apply to take the NAVLE and for further requirements and instructions, please visit icva.net.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING THE APPLICATION PROCESS

APPLICATION FOR "REGULAR" VETERINARY LICENSE

All of the following must be submitted for an application to be considered complete:

1. Application:
 - Properly completed and notarized. **APPLICANT'S SIGNATURE DATE ON PAGE FOUR MUST MATCH THE NOTARIZED DATE.**

2. Fee \$400:
 - This is a **non-refundable** fee and **must be a money order, certified check or cashier's check payable** in US funds only to: AZVMEB. **DO NOT SEND PERSONAL OR BUSINESS CHECKS. WE DO NOT ACCEPT CREDIT CARDS or CASH.**

3. Photo:
 - No larger than 1½" x 2" in size and taken within the preceding 6 months. Place photo in "photo box" on first page of the application if possible. OK to submit a "selfie."

4. Transcript (Official final) or ECFVG/PAVE Certificate of Completion:
 - Applicant is required to request transcript be sent directly to this Board by the AVMA accredited veterinary college from which the applicant graduated. The transcript must indicate graduation date and degree earned. You may submit a copy if in a sealed envelope from your college.
 - If applicant is a graduating/current student at the time of application, a letter from the dean of the veterinary program must be sent directly to this Board stating projected graduation date and good standing. Graduation date must be within 45 days following the exam. Transcript should be received within 60 days of graduation.
 - If applicant is a recent graduate at the time of application, a letter from the Dean stating graduation information and a copy of the diploma is acceptable until the final official transcript is available. Transcript should be received within 60 days of graduation.
 - ECFVG/PAVE: Applicant currently enrolled in ECFVG will submit a program status report from the AVMA and for PAVE a status report from the AAVSB.
 - Upon completion of both programs, applicant will submit a copy of the ECFVG Certificate of Completion issued by the AVMA or a copy of the PAVE Certificate of Completion issued by the AAVSB.

5. LETTER OR CURRENT RÉSUMÉ:
 - Typewritten information summarizing experience and qualifications

6. Note that Moral Character Reference forms are NO LONGER REQUIRED!

7. NAVLE SCORE REPORT:
- Exam was taken within the preceding five years of this application, with a passing score.
 - Applicant is required to request a score transfer directly from the American Association of Veterinary State Boards (AAVSB) to be sent to this office. Contact the AAVSB at aavsb.org
 - If you registered through Arizona when you took the NAVLE, **do not request it again**. Your score report was previously sent to our office.
8. VERIFICATION OF LICENSURE :
- Required only if applicant is and/or has ever been a licensed veterinarian in another state.
 - Applicant is responsible to request verification of licensure from each state or territory, where currently or previously licensed. Each state or territory of the United States must send directly to this Board a verification of licensure to include current standing and status of any current investigation or discipline received for violation of a veterinary medical practice act. Each state's process may differ, and a fee may be assessed. Response time from other states can vary up to 6+ weeks to process. Verifications may be emailed during COVID-related procedures to: licensing@vetboard.az.gov
9. LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION PROFESSIONAL QUALIFICATIONS - FORM INCLUDED IN THIS PACKET:
- Not required if you are a student, new graduate or if you have never held a veterinary license.
 - Letter is to be completed by a veterinarian indicating applicant's professional qualifications.
 - Professional letterhead may be used, in place of form.
10. ARIZONA STATEMENT OF CITIZENSHIP AND ALIEN STATUS FOR STATE PUBLIC BENEFITS – FORM AND INSTRUCTIONS FOR SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION OF CITIZENSHIP INCLUDED IN THIS PACKET.
- Attach the applicable copy of proof of citizenship. (This form does not mean you are required to reside in the State of Arizona in order to apply. **You are proving lawful presence in this country.**)
 - If your name on your application does not match the name on your proof of citizenship, you are required to submit a copy of legal documentation supporting your name change. Example: Marriage License, Divorce Decree (only page granting name change), Adoption, etc. Social Security Cards are not accepted.
11. GOVERNMENT ISSUED ID:
- If your proof of citizenship or proof of lawful presence in this country, for #10 does not contain a photo you are required to submit a government issued photo I.D.
 - Please do not submit Social Security cards, for any reason.

PLEASE NOTE:

**OPTIONAL FEE WAIVER FOR LOW INCOME APPLICANTS: Per A.R.S. 41-1080.01, an applicant applying for an initial license whose family income does not exceed two hundred percent of the federal poverty guidelines may be eligible for a fee waiver. If you believe that you qualify for the waiver, please contact the Board office at 602-542-8166 to request the Application for Waiver of Initial Licensing Fees.

What to expect next!

1. Once your application is received and processed, you will receive an email providing application status information. If documents are needed, you will be given a list of deficiencies.
2. If complete, you will be sent a letter and an email with information about the State exam, which is the next step in the process. Currently, the exam is a "take home," open book exam which will be emailed to you within approximately 1-2 weeks. Board staff will call you to inform you that the exam has been emailed. You will have 2 weeks to complete the exam and return it.
 - Currently, the State exam is 50 questions covering only the Arizona Veterinary Practice Act (i.e., the statutes) and the Arizona Administrative Code (aka, "Administrative Rules").
3. Once you return the exam, please allow up to 1-2 weeks for grading, although during the months of May-July, it may take longer. If you have passed the exam, you will be notified by email and further instructions will be included.
4. **Your next step is to submit the LICENSE ISSUANCE FEE** (\$100 in even-numbered years/\$200 in odd-numbered years).
 - **If you are a student or a recent graduate, proof of graduation AND payment of the \$200 (odd-numbered years) or \$100 (even-numbered years) license issuance fee is required before your license can become active.** A copy of your diploma or official letter from your veterinary college, if available before your final transcript, will be accepted as proof of graduation. If you do submit a copy of your diploma, your final transcript is still expected within 60 days from taking the exam.
 - If you are in the ECFVG or PAVE program, a certificate of completion is required before your license can become active. If you are a new graduate, proof of graduation is required before the license can be issued.
 - You will receive a "wall license" approximately 60 to 90 days after the license is issued.

Please note: You are not allowed to practice until you have confirmed that your license has been updated to active status. You may do this by contacting Board staff or by viewing our on-line directory, found under the Licensing tab, on our website.

During the peak months of May-July, it is possible that we have issued your license before we send you notification of that fact. Our priority is to issue licenses; when we do that, the website directory is automatically updated and has the most up-to-the-moment information.

Please be advised of the following pursuant to Arizona Revised Statutes (ARS) §41-1030: A.R.S. §41-1030(B): An agency shall not base a licensing decision in whole or in part on a licensing requirement or condition that is not specifically authorized by statute, rule or state tribal gaming compact. A general grant of authority in statute does not constitute a basis for imposing a licensing requirement or condition unless a rule is made pursuant to that general grant of authority that specifically authorizes the requirement or condition. A.R.S. §41-1030(D): This section may be enforced in private civil action and relief may be awarded against the state. The court may award reasonable attorney fees, damages and all fees associated with the license application to a party that prevails in an action against the state for a violation of this section. A.R.S. §41-1030(E): A state employee may not intentionally or knowingly violate this section. A violation of this section is cause for disciplinary action or dismissal pursuant to the agency's adopted personnel policy. A.R.S. §41-1030(F): This section does not abrogate the immunity provided by section 12-820.01 or 12-820.02.

6. A foreign passport with a United States visa.
7. An I-94 form with a photograph.
8. A United States citizenship and immigration services employment authorization document or refugee travel document.
9. A United States certificate of naturalization.
10. A United States certificate of citizenship.
11. A tribal certificate of Indian blood.
12. A tribal or bureau of Indian affairs affidavit of birth.
13. Any other license that is issued by the federal government, any other state government, an agency of this state or a political subdivision of this state that requires proof of citizenship or lawful alien status before issuing the license.
