APPLICATION FOR LICENSURE BY UNIVERSAL RECOGNITION

A.R.S. 32-4302

The Universal Recognition policy allows Arizona residents to use an out-of-state professional or occupational license to qualify for an Arizona license to work. To qualify, an applicant must:

- 1. Prove residency in Arizona
- 2. Be currently licensed for at least ONE YEAR in another U.S. state in the discipline applied for and at the same level of practice as recognized in Arizona
- 3. Be in good standing in all states where currently or previously licensed
- 4. Must not have had a license revoked or have voluntarily surrendered a license in any other state or country while under investigation for unprofessional conduct
- 5. Must not have a complaint, allegation, or investigation pending before another regulating entity in another state or country that relates to unprofessional conduct
- 6. Must have met all applicable education, work, exam, and/or clinical supervision requirements in the other state where originally licensed
- 7. TAKE AND PASS THE ARIZONA STATE VETERINARY EXAM (75% score minimum)
- 8. Pay all applicable application and issuance fees to the Arizona State Veterinary Medical Examining Board

Note: This type of license will allow you to work at the same practice level that you are allowed in the state(s) for which you have been licensed at least one year! For example, if you have a "specialty" license in another state that limits your practice to the scope of your specialty (diplomat) board certification, then you may be granted a "Specialty" veterinary license in Arizona that has the same practice limits.


Please read all the enclosed information and instructions carefully before submitting your application. Your application must be complete prior to the deadline for the State exam you wish to take; you will be notified if your application is incomplete. There are no refunds for applications. If you fail the State exam, you will need to re-apply.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING THE APPLICATION PROCESS

APPLICATION FOR VETERINARY LICENSE BY UNIVERSAL RECOGNITION (ARIZONA RESIDENT)

<u>All</u>	Lot the following must be submitted for an application to be considered complete:
1.	 Application: Properly completed and notarized. APPLICANT'S SIGNATURE DATE ON PAGE FOUR MUST MATCH THE NOTARIZED DATE.
2.	Fee \$400: This is a non-refundable fee and must be a money order, certified check or cashier's check payable in US funds only to: AZVMEB. DO NOT SEND PERSONAL OR BUSINESS CHECKS. WE DO NOT ACCEPT CREDIT CARDS or CASH. Please note once the license is approved by the Board, the license issuance fee will be due prior to issuance.
3.	 Photo: ➤ No larger than 1½" x 2" in size and taken within the preceding 6 months. Place photo in "photo box" on first page of the application.
4.	Proof of Arizona Residency: ➤ Submit a copy of ONE of these documents: • Valid Arizona drivers license • Current Arizona motor vehicle registration • Military Form 2058 • Current Arizona voter registration • Proof of filing Arizona income taxes in the most recent tax year.
5.	 Verification of Licensure: Applicant is responsible to request verification of licensure from each state or territory, where currently or previously licensed. Each state or territory of the United States must send directly to this Board a verification of licensure to include current standing and status of any current investigation or discipline received for violation of a veterinary medical practice act. Each state's process may differ, and a fee may be assessed. Response time from other states can vary up to 6+ weeks to process.
6.	Arizona Statement of Citizenship and Alien Status for State Public Benefits – Form and Instructions for Supporting Documentation of Citizenship Included in this Packet. > Attach the applicable copy of proof of citizenship. > If your name on your application does not match the name on your proof of citizenship, you are required to submit a copy of legal documentation supporting your name change. Example: Marriage License, Divorce Decree (only page granting name change), Adoption, etc. Social Security Cards are not accepted.
7.	 GOVERNMENT ISSUED ID: If your proof of citizenship or proof of lawful presence in this country, for #6, does not contain a photo you are required to submit a government issued photo I.D. Please do not submit Social Security cards, for any reason.

**OPTIONAL FEE WAIVER FOR LOW INCOME APPLICANTS: Per A.R.S. 41-1080.01, an applicant applying for an initial license whose family income does, not exceed two hundred percent of the federal poverty guidelines may be eligible for a fee waiver. If you believe that you quality for the waiver, please contact the Board office at 602-542-8166 to request the Application for Waiver of Initial Licensing Fees.

Please be advised of the following pursuant to Arizona Revised Statutes (A.R.S.) §41-1030:

A.R.S. §41-1030(B): An agency shall not base a licensing decision in whole or in part on a licensing requirement or condition that is not specifically authorized by statute, rule or state tribal gaming compact. A general grant of authority in statute does not constitute a basis for imposing a licensing requirement or condition unless a rule is made pursuant to that general grant of authority that specifically authorizes the requirement or condition. **A.R.S. §41-1030(D):** This section may be enforced in private civil action and relief may be awarded against the state. The court may award reasonable attorney fees, damages and all fees associated with the license application to a party that prevails in an action against the state for a violation of this section. **A.R.S. §41-1030(E):** A state employee may not intentionally or knowingly violate this section. A violation of this section is cause for disciplinary action or dismissal pursuant to the agency's adopted personnel policy. **A.R.S. §41-1030(F):** This section does not abrogate the immunity provided by section 12-820.01 or 12-820.02. Pursuant to Section 32-4302, Arizona Revised Statutes, a person shall be granted an occupational or professional license or certificate if the person has been licensed or certified in another state for at least twelve months, the license or certificate is in the same discipline and at the same practice level as the license or certificate for which the person is applying in this state and the person meets other conditions prescribed by Section 32-4302, Arizona Revised Statutes.

NOTICE: Pursuant to Section 41-1093.01, Arizona Revised Statutes, an agency shall limit all occupational regulations to regulations that are demonstrated to be necessary to specifically fulfill a public health, safety or welfare concern. Pursuant to Sections 41-1093.02 and 41-1093.03, Arizona Revised Statutes, you have the right to petition this agency to repeal or modify the occupational regulation or bring an action in a court of general jurisdiction to challenge the occupational regulation and to ensure compliance with Section 41-1093.01, Arizona Revised Statutes.

Title IV of the federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996 (the "Act"), 8 U.S.C. § 1621, provides that, with certain exceptions, only United States citizens, United States non-citizen nationals, non-exempt "qualified aliens" (and sometimes only particular categories of qualified aliens), nonimmigrants, and certain aliens paroled into the United States are eligible to receive state or local public benefits. With certain exceptions, a professional license and commercial license issued by a State agency is a State public benefit.

EVIDENCE OF U.S. CITIZENSHIP, U.S. NATIONAL STATUS OR ALIEN STATUS

You must submit supporting legal documentation (i.e. marriage certificate) if the name on your evidence is not the same as your current legal name.

Evidence showing authorized presence in the United State includes the following:

- 1. An Arizona driver license issued after 1996 or an Arizona non-operating identification license.
- 2. A driver license issued by a state that verifies lawful presence in the United States.
- 3. A birth certificate or delayed birth certificate showing birth in one of the 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico (on or after January 13, 1941), Guam, the U.S. Virgin Islands (on or after January 17, 1917), American Samoa, or the Northern Mariana Islands (on or after November 4, 1986, Northern Mariana Islands local time)
- 4. A United States certificate of birth abroad.
- 5. A United States passport. ***Passport must be signed***
- 6. A foreign passport with a United States visa.
- 7. An I-94 form with a photograph.
- 8. A United States citizenship and immigration services employment authorization document or refugee travel document.
- 9. A United States certificate of naturalization.
- 10. A United States certificate of citizenship.
- 11. A tribal certificate of Indian blood.
- 12. A tribal or bureau of Indian affairs affidavit of birth.
- 13. Any other license that is issued by the federal government, any other state government, an agency of this state or a political subdivision of this state that requires proof of citizenship or lawful alien status before issuing the license.

What to expect next!

PLEASE NOTE:

- Once your application is received and processed, you will receive an email indicating whether your application is complete. If it is not, you will be provided with a list of missing documents/information.
- When your application is complete, you will be notified via mail and email. We will
 mail to you hard copies of the Arizona statutes and Administrative Rules which are
 the focus of the State exam (during COVID-related procedures). These materials
 can also be found on the Board's website at vetboard.az.gov. Go to the "Statutes
 and Rules" tab.
- In approximately 1-2 weeks, the State exam will be EMAILED to you. You will need to print the exam, complete it, and return it via email, fax, or mail. It is an "open book" test (during COVID-related procedures). The exam is 50 true/false questions focused on the AZ Veterinary Practice Act (statutes) and Administrative Rules.
- Please allow 1-2 weeks for the exam grading. An email and letter will be sent with your exam score and information about the license issuance fee (see below).
- License information can be confirmed on the Board's website directory at vetboard.az.gov.
- A license issuance fee of \$100 (in even-numbered years) or \$200 (in odd-numbered years) will be due before your license can be issued.
 - O The issuance fee may be paid by personal check, business check, cashier's check, certified check, or money order. We do not take credit cards for this fee.
- Please remember all licenses expire 12/31 of every even-numbered year!

<u>Please note:</u> You are not allowed to practice until you have confirmed that your license has been updated to Active status. You may do this by contacting Board staff, by viewing our on-line directory, found on the home page of the Board's website at vetboard.az.gov, or upon receipt of a letter with your license "wallet card" bearing your license number.
